

**RESOLUTION NO. 20100729-092**

**WHEREAS**, the Old L. C. Anderson High School, located in East Austin, served for 64 years as Austin's high school for blacks; and

**WHEREAS**, in 1971, the school was closed as a part of a plan to desegregate Austin schools; and

**WHEREAS**, the history of the Old Anderson High School has been preserved by the alumni through memorabilia that has been located at the Doris Miller Auditorium; and

**WHEREAS**, this memorabilia includes display cases of championship trophies, reels of game film, band instruments, majorette costumes and portraits of educators; and

**WHEREAS**, the community desires that this historical exhibit be made available for public viewing not only during the Old Anderson High School reunions or Black History Month but throughout the year; and

**WHEREAS**, the George Washington Carver Museum is the preferred permanent location to exhibit the memorabilia, which will allow the public the


opportunity to view a significant portion of the City of Austin's heritage; **NOW,


