Access on Analog Service

- Time-Warner Cable will cease analog transmission of all PEG access channels on October 1
- Most basic and standard tier (analog) subscribers will need additional equipment (QAM tuner) to receive PEG
- Customers may request one converter box, free for a limited time
- Council action in August helpful
- Subscribers may file a complaint with Telecommunications and Regulatory Affairs. Contact Jane.Reina@ci.austin.tx.us or 974-2999

Public Access Television (1/3)

- Austin's three public access channels are managed by an outside agency (channelAustin)
- Sept 2011 current management contract expires
- Nov 2010 RFP for new contract anticipated
- Tonight Commission recommendations anticipated

Public Access - Funding (2/3)

- Muni franchise funded operations at \$617K/yr
- State franchise funds operations at \$0/yr
- Closing in a framework for sustainable funding for operations:
 - Cost reductions, esp. thru technology
 - Increased grant and foundation funding
 - · Leverage capital funds for operating revenue
 - Utilize resources for revenue generation
 - City funding to bridge revenue gap

Public Access – Future (3/3)

- Some emerging themes:
 - Beyond television broaden support for community media
 - Relevance for the "digital native" generation
 - Online services streaming, submission, program guide, online community
 - Increased support for community groups
 - Public access could be the "channel 6" for Austin nonprofits and community organizations
