Form-Based Code Overview

- **Form-Based code (FBC)** is a means of regulating development to achieve a specific urban form.
- Form-based codes address:
 - ☐ The relationship between building facades and the public realm (the area within the public right-of-way that typically includes sidewalks, streets and other public improvements)
 - ☐ The relationship of buildings to one another, and the scale and character of streets
- Form-based codes produce predictable results in the form and character of buildings and the public realm

Airport Boulevard Form-Based Code (FBC) Initiative – Project Area Background

- Project Area is 2 ½ miles along Airport Boulevard:
 - ☐ Lamar Boulevard at the North end
 - ☐ Koenig/Highway 290-East in the middle
 - ☐ Hwy I-35 at the South end
- One story commercial development with the buildings typically separated from the street by surface parking lots of various sizes and configurations.
- Railroad track for “Metrorail” runs along almost the entire length of Project Area
- Highland Mall near mid-section of Project Area
- Mueller Project located just outside the Project Area
- Brentwood/Highland and North Loop neighborhoods most directly within Project Area
- Austin City Council has directed that an advisory group be established to assist in public outreach and to provide feedback

 - ☐ Visioning and Charrette
 - ☐ Draft Form-based Code “Master Plan”
 - ☐ Second-Round Public Input
 - ☐ Proposed Final Form-based Code “Master Plan”
 - ☐ Adoption (by City Council) of the Form-based Code “Master Plan”
 - ☐ Integration of the Form-based Code into Existing Regulatory Framework
 - ☐ Adoption (by City Council) of the Form-based Code Ordinance of FBC Ordinance
