<u>SUMMARY STAFF RECOMMENDATION</u>: Staff recommends the proposed zoning change from family residence, neighborhood conservation (SF-3-NCCD) combining district to family residence – historic landmark, neighborhood conservation (SF-3-H-NCCD) combining district zoning.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR LANDMARK DESIGNATION:

The Adams House qualifies for landmark designation for its significance in architecture, historical associations, and community value. The ca. 1911 house received its Colonial Revival styling in a 1930s remodel, and is a good example of Colonial Revival detailing. The house is associated with W.T. Adams, the chief clerk of the State Department of Agriculture, and has won several awards for its restoration after a long period of decline. It is now a bed and breakfast inn and a landmark in Hyde Park.

HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION ACTION: Recommended the proposed zoning change from family residence – neighborhood conservation (SF-3-NCCD) combining district to family residence – historic landmark – neighborhood conservation (SF-3-H-NCCD) combining district zoning. Vote: 6-0 (Leary ill).

<u>DEPARTMENT COMMENTS</u>: The house is listed in the Comprehensive Cultural Resources Survey (1984), but without a priority for research.

Architectural Description:

Two-story rectangular-plan hipped-roof frame Colonial Revival-styled house with a two-story sunroof addition to the left of the principal block; paired 1:1 fenestration. The central front entry has a flat-roofed portico with a balustrade above consisting of a plain vertical stick railing. Leaded glass sidelights and a transom frame the front door.

Historical Associations:

The house was originally built in 1911 as a one-story L-plan house with a wraparound porch, when it was the home of Richard Gesswein, who was a salesman and clerk for Hill & Hill Groceries and Feed on Congress Avenue. Gesswein died in 1916, and by 1922, the house had been purchased by W.T. Adams, who had moved to Austin to take a job as Chief Clerk of the Texas Department of Agriculture. Adams remodeled the house by 1935 into a one-story square plan house. In 1939, he added a two-room, second-story addition to the house. The sunroom and front porch may have been added later, but Gregg Free, who restored the house in 1996, believes that they were a part of the 1930s additions, even though they do not appear on the 1962 Sanborn map of the property.

Adams grew up in Rusk, Texas, and became a prominent educator in Tyler. He was a teacher, principal, and eventually superintendent of schools in Tyler until 1916, when after a year as the superintendent of schools in Mexia, Texas, he took the bar exam and moved to Houston to practice law. He and his family moved to Austin around 1921 when he became the Chief Clerk of the Department of Agriculture, an executive position. He also worked as an inspector and an assistant entomologist for the Department of Agriculture, and apparently maintained a private practice of law; the 1930 U.S. Census report shows W.T. as a lawyer with a general practice. W.T. and May Adams are shown as living at this house on Avenue G along with their son, W.T., Jr. W.T. Adams was then 63 years old; May was 61.

Adams passed away in 1943; his widow, May, continued to live here until her death in 1955. The house then became a rental unit and suffered a great deal of decline until it was purchased by Gregg Free in 1996. Gregg restored the house, including the original slate and longleaf pine floors, sash windows, and 12-foot ceilings. The current owner purchased the house in 1997, and has been operating it as the Adams House Bed and Breakfast.















The 1922 Sanborn map shows the house (bottom right corner of the map) as a one-story wing-and-gable plan house with a wraparound porch.

The Adams House 4300 Avenue G

Turning 100 years old next year, the Adams House is located in historic Hyde Park, Austin's oldest residential neighborhood. The house was built as a single-story, L-shaped bungalow with wraparound porches on the east and south sides, probably by the first owners Richard and Gennic Gesswein. Mr. and Mrs. W.T. Adams purchased the house in 1922 and elevated it to a two-story colonial revival style house in 1931. The Adams lived in the house for over 30 years.

After Mrs. Adams died in 1955, the house was sold several times. It was turned into four apartments that were occupied by various renters for over 30 years.

In 1996, the house was renovated by historic preservation architect Gregory Free. Original floors, sash windows, slate and long leaf pine flooring and 12 foot ceilings were meticulously restored. The writing on the living room south wall (in pencil on the shiplap) read: "by Sam Payne June 10, 1911" and "Sam Payne Austin Tex. June 10, 1911."

John and Sidney Lock purchased the home in 1997 and began operating it as a bed and breakfast establishment.

The Adams House was given the Heritage Society of Austin Award for Preservation in December of 1997.

- Married May (really Mary Ann Yarbrough, May was a nickname) Herrin in 1897
- Instructor, principal and superintendent at Tyler High School for 21 years before moving from Tyler. (1895 or before)
- Superintendent of the Tyler Public Schools from 1905 to 1916
- · Resigned to take a similar position in Mexia for one year
- Takes the bar exam in Austin in 1917
- Moves to Houston to to practice law and later starts teaching at the Prosso Preparatory
 School for a year or so while also working for Singer Sewing Machines
- Family moves to Austin in 1921 to a house on University Avenue and takes a position with the Texas State Agriculture Department
- Family moves to 4300 Avenue G (where they live until their deaths)
- Attended/audited classes at The University of Texas
- May (Mary Ann Yarbrough Herrin Adams) was an artist and while she had given up oil
 painting after marriage, took water color classes in Austin. Photographs of several of her
 paintings are shown in the last section of this compilation.
- Was with the State Dept. of Agriculture for over 23 years
- Served as Chief Clerk for the Texas Dept. of Agriculture during the George Terrell

John Lock was a Board Certified Estate Planning and Taxation attorney and CPA for many years in Austin. He received his undergraduate degree from Texas A&M University, and his law degree from the University of Texas.

John died on January 24, 2004 from ALS (Lou Gehrig's disease), but for the years leading up to his death, John continued his law practice from the bungalow behind the Adams House. He is still fondly remembered by his many neighbors in Hyde Park as a man who lived and died graciously, with his glass always more than half full.

Sidney Lock received her first degree from the University of Texas in medical technology. She worked for the Dept. of Health as a microbiologist for 22 years. Returning to U.T., she received a second degree in interior design twenty years later.

Sidney and John purchased the Adams House from Gregg Free in February, 1998. Gregg is an historic preservation architect, and saved the house from ruin and disrepair.

After an illness of more than a year. Richard R. Gesswein, aged 37 years, died at his home, 4200 Avenue G. yesterday mor ing. Decedent is survived by a wife and one child. He was a member of the Highland Presbyterian Church at I also a member of Heart of Guk a.np. Woodmen of the World, and the Protection Fire Company. The funeral will be held this (Sunday) afternoon at 2 o'clock from the residence, the services to be conducted by Rev. Mr. Joplin. 

The initial research performed by Gregory Free indicates that the house was most likely built in 1912 for Mr. and Mrs. Richard R. Gesswein. Mr. Gesswein, a clerk at Hill & Hill Grocers and Feed on Congress Avenue. The removal of later additions and wallcoverings on the interior of the house revealed the house's origin as a one story Victorian cottage with a projecting parlor room and a porch wrapping around the south and east sides. This was confirmed in the 1921 Sanborn Map. Between this date and 1935, the house was enlarged to two stories and given its present Colonial Revival styling by subsequent owners.
