Subject: Authorize execution of an Interlocal Agreement between the City and Travis County, providing for financial cooperation to facilitate the City and County's participation in a feasibility study conducted by the National Center for Arts and Technology with the City contributing \$25,000 to the effort.

Amount and Source of Funding: This is a reimbursement of the Fiscal Year 2009-2010 Operating Budget of the Management Services Department.

Fiscal Note: There is no unanticipated fiscal impact. A fiscal note is not required.

MBE/WBE: This Interlocal Agreement is exempt from the MBE/WBE Ordinance. This exemption is in compliance with Chapter 2-9C of the City Code (Minority Owned and Women Owned Business Enterprise Procurement Program). No subcontracting opportunities were identified; therefore, no goals were established for this contract.

Prior Council Action: April 29, 2010 - Approved negotiation and execution of Interlocal Agreement.

This interlocal agreement reflects the financial arrangement between the City of Austin and Travis County for purposes of reimbursing the City in the amount of \$25,000 to participate in a feasibility study conducted by the National Center for Arts and Technology. This study will assess the possibility of introducing the successful Bidwell's Center model of trade/arts program developed by William E. Strickland, Jr., in the Pittsburgh community to service disadvantaged youth and unemployed adults. This model has been successfully duplicated in many areas of the U.S. as well as overseas. In the Pittsburgh area, this program offers after-school art classes (ceramics, digital media, sculpture, etc.) for high school students and vocational education for adults who may or may not have finished school.

The Dell Corporation will provide half of the \$150,000 study budget for a planning grant. AISD, Travis County, and the City of Austin will each contribute \$25,000 to this effort.
