Communications and Technology Management RECOMMENDATION FOR COUNCIL ACTION Item No. 4

Subject: Authorize negotiation and execution of an Interlocal Agreement with the CITY OF MUSTANG RIDGE, TX for a one-year term to be automatically renewed annually on October 1st, whereby Mustang Ridge will provide the documentation and notification required for the City of Austin to continue to provide Mustang Ridge with addressing services for 911 purposes.

Amount and Source of Funding: Compensation will be made to the City of Austin by the Capital Area Council of Governments (CAPCOG), pursuant to the Interlocal Agreement signed by the City of Austin and CAPCOG as approved by Austin City Council on August 20, 2009.

Fiscal Note: There is no unanticipated fiscal impact. A fiscal note is not required.

Prior Council Action: August 20, 2009 – Council approved an Interlocal Agreement with CAPCOG.

The CTM 911 Addressing group is responsible for subdivision and site plan review, street name changes, address changes and address assignment on a county-wide basis, including the City of Austin full and limited purpose jurisdiction and ETJ, unincorporated Travis County and most of the municipalities within Travis County, as well as maintenance of the Master Street Address Guide ("911 Database") for the county.

Address assignment and maintenance in the unincorporated areas of Travis County is authorized through an interlocal agreement between the City of Austin and Travis County, however, the City currently does not have any written agreements with the municipalities within Travis County for which the City provides these services.

This Interlocal Agreement between the City of Austin and the City of Mustang Ridge will establish an official working agreement between the two cities, whereby Mustang Ridge will continue to provide newly recorded subdivision plats, site plans, annexation ordinances and any other necessary documentation and/or notification required for Austin to continue to provide addressing services for 911 purposes. Similar agreements with each of the municipalities in Travis County will be initiated in the near future. The City will continue to be paid for these services through an existing interlocal agreement with CAPCOG.
