RESOLUTION NO. 1 2 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the City of Austin has identified cultural arts as an essential element to the quality of life of its residents and health of its economy; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the Art in Public Places Program (AIPP) has invested more 8 than \$5 million of City resources since 1985 to commission and site art in 9 public places throughout the City; and 10 11 WHEREAS, the Create Austin Plan recommends enhancing and expanding 12 the City's AIPP Program by identifying and securing ongoing funding for 13 the maintenance and preservation of public art; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, the AIPP ordinance was revised in 2002 to include public art in all new street and streetscape improvement projects, which are now being 17 implemented through the capital improvements program funds and general 18 obligation bonds; and 19 20 WHEREAS, artists involved in creating and installing public art have 21 experienced difficulties with fees and requirements associated with 22 23 obtaining City permits; and 24 WHEREAS, the City Council adopted Resolution 20100311-038 directing 25 the City Manager to identify barriers experienced by artists working on city-26 27 sponsored art projects with members of the arts community and make recommendation for process improvements for assisting artists participating 28 29 in city-sponsored art projects; and 30 WHEREAS, the Austin Arts Commission reviewed the findings of a permit 31 survey of artists who have completed projects in the City's Right-of-Way as 32 33 well as the anticipated permit cost of 50 current public art projects; and 34 **WHEREAS**, on October 18, 2010, the Austin Arts Commission passed a 35 36 motion to recommend that city-sponsored art projects be exempt from any applicable city permit fees to reduce the significant impact on small budgets 37 for fabrication and installation of artwork; and 38

2	and the Department of Transportation (DOT) determined that fee waivers for
3	city-sponsored art projects would not have a negative impact on their
4	operating budget; NOW THEREFORE

9	That the City Manager is directed to develop and administer a fee waiver
10	program for city-sponsored art projects.
