Program Overview

What the Voters Approved

- \$90 million bond program aimed at addressing mobility priorities
- Multi-modal projects:
 - Streets/Roadways
 - Partnership Projects
 - Signals/Intersections
 - Pedestrian/ADA







Process for Bond Proposal Development

- Over 3,000 gaps and bottlenecks in Austin's mobility network were identified
 - City, partner agencies, public input process
- Prioritization criteria approved by Council
- Criteria used to evaluate/rank projects
- Highly ranked projects included in proposal
- Council-appointed Citizens Task Force reviewed proposal and made recommendation
- CM presented draft and final bond proposal to Council

Strategic Principles Inform Proposal Development









- Focus on near-term needs obligate funds within 2 years where possible
- Design projects for next series of funding opportunities
- Promote multiple forms of travel, reduce reliance on automobile, seek cost effective and sustainable solutions
- Respond to immediate congestion needs
- Provide geographic balance
- Position City to leverage State, federal dollars, coordinate with regional partners
- Preserve and maintain existing investments

What Projects are Included in the 2010 Bond Program?

Mobility Priorities:

 28 Projects identified through prioritization process to address specific mobility gaps and bottlenecks

Signals and Intersections:

- Traffic signal system improvements, upgrades
- Intersection improvements

Pedestrian/ADA Improvements

- Sidewalk, curb improvements for improved accessibility in compliance with ADA requirements
- Sidewalk and bicycle facilities identified in the City's Bicycle and Sidewalk Master Plans

- Brodie Lane: Sidewalk accessibility

Bond Program Implementation: Program Areas

Pedestrian/ADA: \$39.1 million

Includes Boardwalk

Signals/Intersections: \$ 4.2 million

Partnership Projects: \$23.2 million

• Street Reconstruction: \$23.5 million

TOTAL \$90 million

Bond Program Implementation: Items Approved by Council

- FY 2011 Capital Budget Amendment
 - \$56 million planned to be obligated in FY11
- AFA Agreements with TxDOT
 - Interim improvements at Oak Hill "Y"
 - IH35 Frontage: 53rd to Barbara Jordan Blvd.
- Field Services Rotation List
 - Design Svcs for Mobility Bond pedestrian projects

Bond Program Implementation: FY 11 Budget Amendment

- Amount to be <u>obligated</u> for 2010 Mobility Program in FY11
- Pedestrian/ADA: \$27.3 Million
 - Includes the Boardwalk Trail: \$14.4 Million
- Streets/Roadways: \$9.8 Million
- Partnership/Mobility: \$17 Million
- Traffic Signals/Intersections: \$2.3 Million

Bond Program Implementation: Overall Project Status

- 5 Projects in Planning/Preliminary Design
 - (East & West Riverside Dr Corridor Improvements; FM 969 (E MLK Blvd) Corridor Improvements; Airport Blvd from N Lamar Blvd to US 183 Corridor Improvements)
- 31 Projects in Design Phase
 - (S Congress Ave widening near William Cannon Dr; Y at Oak Hill Intersection Improvements)
- 7 Projects in Bid Phase
 - (ADA, Sidewalk, Ramp & Bikeway Improvements Construction; IH 35 Corridor Development Program Professional Svcs; Transportation Corridor Studies Professional Svcs)
- 0 Project in Construction Phase
