Purpose: Dept of Energy grant "Austin Weatherization Innovations Grant"

Grantee: A Nurtured World (1House at a Time)

Co-sponsors: Austin Housing Repair Coalition

Neighborhood Housing, Austin Energy, GO Bond sub-recipient non-profits, Austin Water, Texas Gas and area non-profits caring for low income families, elderly and the disabled.

Purpose: Innovative Partnerships to perform whole house weatherization – holistic approach.

Particulars of the proposed whole home approach:

- 1. Coordinates health, safety, and resource efficiency interventions in low-income families' homes from start to finish, making it safe and affordable for these families to stay in their homes and neighborhoods.
- 2. Provides training for future leaders in whole house retrofits and builds a market to retain those new green job opportunities.
- 3. Leverages local volunteer, in-kind, material, and financial investments with federal funding to maximize the impact of each dollar and hour invested;
- 4. Builds a Home Repair database shared by all AHRC members to facilitate future coordination, decrease inefficiency and eliminate duplication and fraud.
- 5. Creates a Wellness Survey that will track the physical and mental health of our low income families before and after the renovations are performed.
- 6. Establishes a holistic weatherization model that can be replicated by other communities across America, especially in the south.

Requests from CDC:

We need a letter of recommendation to City Council to fund the necessary structural repairs to facilitate this whole house approach to weatherization. Funding sources can be spelled out or not.

We need a letter of endorsement of this grant addressed to A Nurtured World backing the grant proposal and further demonstrating the impressive collaborative effort pioneered by the Austin Housing Repair Coalition in our city.
