Additional Backup Information			
The Texas Department of State Health Services was awarded competitive Component II ARRA Communities Putting Prevention to Work State Supplemental funds to implement the Texas Mother Friendly Worksite Policy Initiative. The purpose of this initiative is to facilitate the development and implementation of best practice worksite policies that support breastfeeding. Worksite lactation support is recommended to increase rates of breastfeeding and improve public health. Studies of worksite lactation programs have shown a cost savings of \$3 per dollar invested in breastfeeding support lower health care costs metword use of sick lower reduced turnover and increased			

invested in breastfeeding support, lower health care costs, reduced use of sick leave, reduced turnover and increased morale and productivity. Local health departments are targets for participation in this initiative because of the ability to serve as models/leaders in their communities for creating supportive worksite lactation policies and environments. The City's Health and Human Services Department has been invited to participate in this initiative. It is a noncompetitive process, a one time grant, with an award amount of \$10,000.

The General Fund will not be required to contribute to this grant.
