The Parks and Recreation Department received 2 applications for the naming of the new Chestnut House, which is located at 1183 Chestnut Avenue, in the Rosewood Neighborhood Park. The Chestnut House is a 1,800 square foot multi-purpose facility that sits on the northwest corner of Rosewood Neighborhood Park. The facility will be used as offices for two youth organizations and will also be available for neighborhood meetings.

One naming application suggested that the new Chestnut House be named the Britton, Durst, Howard and Spence Building. These men were prominent leaders that spent time coaching and mentoring youth on the eastside. The second application suggested the building be named after Willie M. Kirk, a former AISD school teacher. Ms. Kirk has been recognized by the Texas State Senate for her community work. Other accolades include her induction into the African American Woman's Hall of Fame, 1993 Black Caucus outstanding Texan Award, and the Carver Library's Martin L. King Award.

On March 14, 2011, the Land & Facilities committee of the Parks Board heard public comment on the suggested
names and forwarded both of the nominations from the community to the Parks & Recreation Board for action. On
April 26, 2011, the Parks and Recreation Board voted to move forward with a recommendation to the City Council
with the name of Britton, Durst, Howard and Spence on a vote of 6-0-1.
