Related Items:			

As part of the City's ongoing effort to comply with the directives of the Federal Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA), the Public Works Department has developed efficient and cost effective methods for sidewalk and curb ramp construction. Improved and expanded pedestrian facilities are a frequently requested infrastructure improvement from the public. The projects proposed for construction under this contract will be funded with 2010 Bond funds.

These projects will be constructed using an Indefinite Delivery/Indefinite Quantity (IDIQ) contract. The IDIQ contract documents include engineered details, specifications, currently identified project locations and total estimated quantities of work. As each project location is further defined, a specific work assignment will be given to the contractor who will complete the scope of work for the unit prices included in the contract. This contracting method provides the flexibility to add projects based on need and priority.

Because projects delivered with IDIQ contracts are designed and engineered in the field as construction progresses, there is a high potential for unknown subsurface conditions and utility conflicts. A 10% contingency has been included to allow for the expeditious processing of any change orders associated with these unknowns and to ensure that the work planned for this contract can be accomplished efficiently.

The contract is for an estimated period of 12 months. Bid documents were distributed to 12 general contractors. Bids were opened on March 24, 2011. Muniz Concrete & Contracting Inc. submitted the lowest of 6 bids received.
