<b>Additional Backup Information</b>	
<p>The City of Austin maintains a rotation list of consulting engineering firms to provide professional civil engineering services. The 2008-2010 General Civil Engineering Rotation List selected 24 firms for projects of all size. This year the rotation list has been split into two separate rotation lists, 2011 Large Scale General Civil Engineering selecting up to 12 firms, and 2011 Small Scale General Civil Engineering selecting up to 16 firms.</p> <p>The 2011 Large Scale General Civil Engineering Rotation List is to accommodate the design of civil engineering projects of a general or routine scope that are large in scale, have a critical schedule, or are of an emergency nature. Typical projects include water and wastewater planning studies and investigations, pipeline design and rehabilitation, utility relocation design, and evaluation of lift station improvements including electrical, mechanical and instrumentation work. The period of service is estimated to be approximately two years or until financial authorization is expended.</p> <p>This request allows for the development of a professional service agreement with each of the twelve (12) recommended firms. This rotation list will allow assignment of projects based on the City's established rotation list management procedures. Should the City be unsuccessful in negotiating a satisfactory agreement with a recommended firm, negotiations will cease with that firm and the funding will be distributed among the remaining firms.</p> <p>Participation subgoals stated in the solicitation were: 1.90% African American; 9.00% Hispanic; 4.90% Asian/Native; and 15.80% Women-owned Business Enterprise. The recommended firms provided MBE /WBE Compliance Plans that met the goals of the solicitation and were approved by the Small and Minority Business Resources Department.</p> <p>Notification of issuance of a Request for Qualifications (RFQ) for the subject services was sent to 332 firms on Tuesday, January 4, 2011. The RFQ was obtained by 199 firms, and 70 firms submitted qualification statements. Seventeen (17) of the firms which submitted qualification statements were certified MBE /WBE firms.</p>
