Subject

Authorize award, negotiation, and execution of a 36-month service agreement contract with: UNIMERICA INSURANCE COMPANY, Golden Valley, MN or one of the other qualified proposers to RFP JSD0105 to provide group term life insurance for City of Austin employees and retirees with three 12-month extension options for a total estimated contract amount not to exceed \$26,950,000.

Amount and Source of Funding

Funding in the amount of \$3,120,000 (will be included in the Fiscal Year 2011-2012 Proposed Operating Budget of the Employees Benefits Fund. Funding for the remaining 27 months of the original 36 months of the original contract period and extension options is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

Fiscal Note

There is no unanticipated fiscal impact. A fiscal note is not required. **Purchasing** Best proposals of eleven proposals received. This request allows for the development of an agreement with a qualified proposer that Council selects. If the City is unsuccessful in negotiating a satisfactory agreement with the selected proposer, negotiations will cease with that provider. Staff will return to Council so that Council may select another qualified proposer and authorize contract negotiations with this provider.

This contract is for a fully-insured group life insurance program for City employees, retirees, and other eligible participants. The services will include providing City employees with existing basic life insurance, supplemental life insurance, dependent life, and accidental death and dismemberment insurance. The contract also continues retired City employee \$1,000 in basic life insurance benefits.

This solicitation gave vendors the opportunity to submit proposals for life insurance for City employees and retirees. The evaluation committee recommends contracting with Unimerica, the current life insurance contractor. Rates quoted are lower than the current rates for the basic and supplemental life insurance and guaranteed for the initial three year contract period. Due to the reduction in basic and supplemental life insurance rates the City estimates a savings of over \$2,000,000 over the current rates. The term of this contract is from January 1, 2012 through December 31, 2014 for the initial period. The one-year extension options, if exercised, will extend the term through December 31, 2017.

Below is a cost breakdown of the contract:

Initial three year contract: \$12,870,000 First contract extension: \$4,555,000 Second contract extension: \$4,692,000 Third contract extension: \$4,833,000

Contract amounts assume an increase of 160 employees in 2012, with a 3% increase in salaries every year of the contract. In addition due to the ability of employees to increase their supplemental life one level during open enrollment, contract amounts are based on all employees electing three times their annual salary in supplemental life.

The evaluation panel consisted of professional and managerial staff from the Human Resources Department, Employee Benefits Division. They are experts in the industry and recommend Unimerica with the best proposal and lowest costs. The evaluation was based on scope of work requirements, business organization and experience, and cost.
