

This budget amendment would allow the Communications and Technology Management (CTM) to accept 9-1-1 revenue funds in the amount of \$985,550 from Travis County. Rule 251.3, Title 1 of the Texas Administrative Code Chapter 251, authorizes the Capital Area Council of Governments (CAPCOG) to transfer unused 9-1-1 revenue to Travis County to help purchase services and equipment that CAPCOG is unable to fund directly. State law requires that the use of these funds must be associated with the design and support of 9-1-1 systems and facilities and/or the purchase and maintenance of equipment and personnel necessary to establish and operate public safety answering points and related operations within Travis County.

9-1-1 revenue funds come to the County every two years. In previous funding cycles, the funds have been used to construct the Combined Transportation, Emergency, and Communications (CTECC) 9-1-1 Backup Center at CAPCOG, and to support 9-1-1 call-taking systems at CTECC. In 2009, Travis County received \$985,550, which will be used in 2011 to replace computers for radio dispatch consoles for all City of Austin and Travis County public safety agencies; to replace the 9-1-1 call and voice radio recording system at CTECC; and to provide necessary cabling, installation services and technical training for City staff in support of these updated services. City of Austin will receive payment of these funds within 30 days of final execution of this interlocal agreement.
