The Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC) is a preventive program that targets women and children below 185% of federal poverty level. The WIC Program provides nutrition education, breastfeeding support, and nutritious foods to pregnant women, infants, and children up to age five. There will be \$252,423 of these funds targeted to the Breastfeeding Peer Counselor area, \$17,844 for Dietetic Internship, \$8,000 for Registered Dietician and an additional \$3,000 targeted for the mini-obesity projects that include the Walk with WIC, Wok with WIC, and Montopolis WIC Garden projects.

Statement Required by Corporate Budget Office: All department grant application requests are reviewed by the Budget Office prior to submission to ensure that the grant minimizes the financial impact to the City.

The General Fund will not be required to contribute to this grant.
