Brushy Creek consists of approximately 725 acres entirely located outside the City's extraterritorial jurisdiction and within the City of Round Rock's extraterritorial jurisdiction. Brushy Creek is generally located north of RM 620, east of Parmer Road, west of Wyoming Springs Drive, and south of FM 1431. Brushy Creek owns and operates its own water and wastewater treatment plants and the City of Austin does not provide wholesale water or wastewater service to it. Brushy Creek currently serves approximately 5,200 connections.						
The Round Rock Independent School District (RRISD) owns approximately 27 acres between Avery Ranch Boulevard and State Highway 45 and plans to construct a school bus maintenance facility at that location by June 2012. The City of Austin is constructing a 24-inch water main along future Pearson Ranch Road, but the water main

The City of Austin is constructing a 24-inch water main along future Pearson Ranch Road, but the water main will not be completed during the construction period of the RRISD school bus maintenance facility. Brushy Creek has an 8-inch water main adjacent to the RRISD 27-acre tract and has agreed to provide interim water service for construction purposes only. The City of Austin would provide permanent retail water service to the RRISD school

bus maintenance facility upon completion of the construction of the City's water main. The City of Austin would not be required to pay Brushy Creek any fees for the provision of interim service to RRISD (RRISD would pay applicable water charges to Brushy Creek), and RRISD would pay all applicable fees to the City of Austin prior to obtaining City retail water service.
