ISSUES:

The Applicant's agent has contacted the Executive Director at the House of Little Angels day care facility.

DEPARTMENT COMMENTS:

The subject rezoning area consists of an office building with driveway and parking area that takes access to South 1st Street. The rezoning area as well as an additional parking area that adjoins to the north was zoned limited office (LO) by a 1981 case. There is a church further to the north (LO; SF-3), single family residences to the east (LO-MU-NP; SF-3-NP), offices (including medical) and a funeral home to the south (GR; GR-CO), and a child care facility to the west (SF-3). Please refer to Exhibits A (Zoning Map) and A-1 (Aerial View).

The Applicant proposes general office (GO) zoning as a step towards occupying a lease space within the building with a proposed guidance services use, a civic use which is first allowed in this district. The proposed tenant will provide outpatient substance abuse treatment that is licensed by the Texas Department of State Health Services. Staff recommends the Applicant's request given its location on an arterial roadway, and compatible adjacent zoning and land uses. The Conditional Overlay limits development to less than 2,000 vehicle trips per day.



SUMMARY STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

The Staff recommendation is to grant general office – conditional overlay (GO-CO) combining district zoning. The Conditional Overlay limits the total number of daily trips to 2,000.

BASIS FOR LAND USE RECOMMENDATION (ZONING PRINCIPLES)

1. The proposed zoning should be consistent with the purpose statement of the district sought.

The general office (GO) district is intended for offices and selected commercial uses predominantly serving community or City-wide needs, such as medical or professional offices. A building in a GO district may contain more than one use.

2. Zoning changes should promote compatibility with adjacent and nearby uses.

Staff recommends the Applicant's request given its location on an arterial roadway, and compatible adjacent zoning and land uses. The Conditional Overlay limits development to less than 2,000 vehicle trips per day.

EXISTING CONDITIONS

Site Characteristics

The rezoning area is a vacant lease space within an office building. The site is relatively flat and there appear to be no significant topographical constraints on the site.

Impervious Cover

The maximum impervious cover allowed by the GO zoning district is 80%, a consistent figure between the zoning and watershed regulations.

Environmental

The site is not located over the Edwards Aquifer Recharge Zone. The site is in the Desired Development Zone. The site is in the Williamson Creek Watershed of the Colorado River Basin, which is classified as a Suburban Watershed by Chapter 25-8 of the City's Land Development Code. Under current watershed regulations, development or redevelopment on this site will be subject to the following impervious cover limits:

According to floodplain maps there is no floodplain within or adjacent to the project boundary.

Standard landscaping and tree protection will be required in accordance with LDC 25-2 and 25-8 for all development and/or redevelopment.

No trees are located on this property. At this time, site specific information is unavailable regarding other vegetation, areas of steep slope, or other environmental features such as bluffs, springs, canyon rimrock, caves, sinkholes, and wetlands.

Under current watershed regulations, development or redevelopment on this site will be subject to the following water quality control requirements:

 Structural controls: Sedimentation and filtration basins with increased capture volume and 2 year detention.

Transportation

No additional right-of-way is needed at this time.

A traffic impact analysis was waived for this case because the applicant agreed to limit the intensity and uses for this development. If the zoning is granted, development should be limited through a conditional overlay to less than 2,000 vehicle trips per day. [LDC, 25-6-117]

Water and Wastewater

The landowner intends to serve the site with City of Austin water and wastewater utilities. The landowner, at own expense, will be responsible for providing any water and wastewater utility improvements, offsite main extensions, utility relocations and or abandonments required by the land use. Water and wastewater utility plans must be reviewed and approved by the Austin Water Utility for compliance with City criteria. All water and wastewater construction must be inspected by the City of Austin. The landowner must pay the City inspection fee with the utility construction. The landowner must pay the tap and impact fee once the landowner makes an application for a City of Austin water and wastewater utility tap permit.

Site Plan and Compatibility Standards

Site plans will be required for any new development other than single-family or duplex residential.

Any development which occurs in an SF-6 or less restrictive zoning district which is located 540-feet or less from property in an SF-5 or more restrictive zoning district will be subject to compatibility development regulations.

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The site is subject to compatibility standards. Along the West property line, the following standards apply:

- No structure may be built within 25 feet of the property line.
- No structure in excess of two stories or 30 feet in height may be constructed within 50 feet of the property line.
- No structure in excess of three stories or 40 feet in height may be constructed within 100 feet of the property line.
- No parking or driveways are allowed within 25 feet of the property line.
- A landscape area at least 25 feet wide is required along the property line. In addition, a
 fence, berm, or dense vegetation must be provided to screen adjoining properties from
 views of parking, mechanical equipment, storage, and refuse collection.
- for a structure more than 100 feet but not more than 300 feet from property zoned SF-5 or more restrictive, 40 feet plus one foot for each 10 feet of distance in excess of 100 feet from the property zoned SF-5 or more restrictive.
- An intensive recreational use, including a swimming pool, tennis court, ball court, or playground, may not be constructed 50 feet or less from adjoining SF-3 property.
 Additional design regulations will be enforced at the time a site plan is submitted.

The owner of the property located at 6104 South 1st Street proposes to lease Suite 105 of his existing retail center to a substance abuse treatment center known as Changing How I Live Life or CHILL. The zoning change is a first step in this leasing process to allow for the use of 'Guidance Services'.

PROPOSED TENANT

The proposed tenant, Changing How I Live Life (CHILL), is a licensed outpatient substance abuse treatment center that has been a part of the Austin community for 12 years. Over the years, they have established themselves as a reputable treatment center assisting adolescents ages 13-17 as well as adults. The center offers intimate group counseling sessions with a maximum of 8 patients per counselor. CHILL adheres to a strict Zero Tolerance Policy in order to create a safe and effective environment for their clients as well as the community in which they serve. They also maintain a strict vetting process to determine if an individual is appropriate for the programs they offer. CHILL has established a positive reputation with its neighbors at its current location on Montopolis Drive. Letters of support from two of its neighboring businesses are attached. The current neighbors of CHILL have had no negative impact on their businesses as a result of CHILL's proximity to them. The goal of CHILL is to continue to foster open communication and continuing compromise with the community in order to provide the best outcome for its clients as well as the community it serves.

HOURS OF OPERATION

CHILL will maintain its current hours of operation at the new location on South 1st. These hours are from 10:00AM to 9:00PM. However, it is important to know that the morning, afternoon, and early evening hours between 10:00AM and 5:30PM are reserved for administrative duties performed by staff only. During this administrative time, the owner is usually the only individual on the premises. In rare cases, a one-on-one patient/counselor session may occur before 5:30PM. These one-on-one sessions are by appointment only and are available to clients who require more flexibility in their schedule due to full-time employment.

It is understood that the children of the adjacent Learning Center are indoors no later than 5:00PM to prepare for dinner and/or be picked up by parents. In addition, the Learning Center closes at 6:00PM. Since the group counseling sessions provided by the proposed treatment center do not begin until 5:30PM, there will be no chance of interaction between the children of the Learning Center and the clients of the proposed treatment center.

This new location on South 1st will provide those students utilizing public transportation a shorter and safer distance to travel to attend their counseling sessions. CHILL also provides an approved DWI Intervention Program to adults seeking to satisfy legal requirements. The new proposed site on South 1st will provide those adult clients coming from West Austin with a more centralized location.



PUBLIC HEARING INFORMATION

This zoning/rezoning request will be reviewed and acted upon at two public hearings: before the Land Use Commission and the City Council. Although applicants and/or their agent(s) are expected to attend a public hearing, you are not required to attend. However, if you do attend, you have the opportunity to speak FOR or AGAINST the proposed development or change. You may also contact a neighborhood or environmental organization that has expressed an interest in an application affecting your neighborhood.

During its public hearing, the board or commission may postpone or continue an application's hearing to a later date, or may evaluate the City staff's recommendation and public input forwarding its own recommendation to the City Council. If the board or commission announces a specific date and time for a postponement or continuation that is not later than 60 days from the announcement, no further notice is required.

During its public hearing, the City Council may grant or deny a zoning request, or rezone the land to a less intensive zoning than requested but in no case will it grant a more intensive zoning.

However, in order to allow for mixed use development, the Council may add the MIXED USE (MU) COMBINING DISTRICT to certain commercial districts. The MU Combining District simply allows residential uses in addition to those uses already allowed in the seven commercial zoning districts. As a result, the MU Combining District allows the combination of office, retail, commercial, and residential uses within a single development.
