Additional Backup Information								
The Austin City Council established a strategic energy policy for Austin Energy through the adoption of Resolutions 030828-38 and 030925-02. These resolutions and Austin Energy's Generation Plan calls for the development and use of clean energy by Austin Energy and sets a goal of 35% of its energy from renewable energy sources by December 31, 2020. The recommended project offers Austin Energy competitively priced renewable energy, environmental attributes, and the opportunity to continue progress towards its renewable goal. This contract will provide for the purchase of the full output of an approximately 91-megawatt wind power project to be constructed by MAP Royalty, Inc., in Webb County, Texas. The new wind project is expected to come online by the end of 2012 and will comprise approximately 57 wind turbines.								
construction, operation, or maintenance of the project during that period. The agreement will provide for a non- escalating fixed price of between \$35 and \$45 per megawatt-hour of energy produced, the quantity of which will vary
