Authorize award and execution of a 58-month requirements service agreement through the State of Texas Department of Information Resources (DIR) cooperative purchasing program with AT&T CORP., Dallas, TX for long distance telephone service and further authorize execution of Exhibit H to the TEX-AN NG Community Technology Services Agreement between the City, AT&T CORP., and DIR to facilitate direct payment for long distance telephone services to DIR in an estimated amount not to exceed \$1,750,000, with five 12-month extension options in an estimated amount not to exceed \$350,000 per extension option for a total estimated contract amount not to exceed \$3,500,000.

Amount and Source of Funding

Funding in the amount of \$29,167 is available in the Fiscal Year 2010-2011 Operating Budgets of various City departments. Funding in the amount of \$350,000 is contingent upon approval of the Fiscal Year 2011-2012 Operating Budgets of various City departments. Funding for the remaining 45 months of the original contract period and extension options is contingent upon available funding in future budgets.

<p>This contract is for long distance phone services for the City of Austin. While there will be a contract for long distance services as provided by AT&T, there is also a three-way agreement between the City, AT&T, and DIR, as payments will be made directly to DIR, per the contract between DIR and AT&T, to be billed monthly.</p> <p>AT&T owns all of the copper infrastructure that provides these services. Contracting with AT&T through DIR allows the City to avoid the additional fees another provider would charge to use the AT&T infrastructure. Our current savings with the new contract will result in a 28 – 58% reduction in the per minute/per usage rate dependent upon the type of long distance service utilized (intra-lata, inter-lata, Interstate, Canada, etc).</p> <p>Our previous services were authorized under the DIR Contract Texan 2000, which expires August 31st. This contract was originally with Southwestern Bell and later assigned to AT&T after their merger. The previous RCA and contract was for a 10 year period: \$2.5 million for the initial 5 year period, with \$500,000for each 12 month extension option for a grand total of \$5.0 million. The total expenditures for the previous 5 year period for long distance service was \$1.1 million.</p> <p>The initial period of 58 months with 5 each 12 month extensions was selected in order to be in alignment with the new DIR contract.</p> <p>The top five users of this service are AE, AWU, CTM, PARD and Health.</p>
