Authorize negotiation and execution of Amendment No. 1 to an Interlocal Agreement with the Capital Area Council of Governments (CAPCOG) for aerial laser measurement services for high-resolution elevation data and contours through an existing contract between CAPCOG and Sanborn Map Company, Inc. to extend the interlocal agreement for twelve months and to increase the interlocal agreement in an amount not to exceed \$100,000 for a total agreement amount not to exceed \$450,000.

Amount and Source of Funding

Funding in the amount of \$100,000 is contingent upon approval of the Fiscal Year 2011-2012 Operating Budget of the Financial and Administrative Services Department, Communication and Technology Management.

This Interlocal Agreement between the City of Austin and Capital Area Council of Governments (CAPCOG) is for aerial laser measurement services to acquire approximately 1050 square miles of Light Detection and Ranging (LiDAR) data with high vertical accuracy in the Austin area. This data is used by all City of Austin departments working with Global Information Systems (GIS) and the captured contour data will be used to meet the immediate needs of the City's strategic initiatives for homeland security, public safety, infrastructure management, land development activities, and quality of life.

This work was not completed this spring due to weather and tree canopy conditions and the contract term expires on September 15, 2011. This proposed Amendment No. 1 will extend the contract by twelve months to allow for the completion of the work and increase the contract amount by \$100,000 for a total contract amount not to exceed \$450,000.
