Bluebonnet Electric Cooperative, Inc. (BEC) is a rural electric cooperative that provides electric utility service to approximately 1,100 meters in the eastern part of the City of Austin. The City annexed the area in which BEC is authorized by the Public Utility Commission of Texas to provide service. BEC's current franchise expires on August 30, 2011.

Key terms of the non-exclusive franchise agreement are as follows:

- Term 10-year initial term with 5-year extension for total of 15 years;
- Compensation: Franchise Fee of three (3) percent of gross revenues paid to the City on quarterly basis;
- Notice by City to Bluebonnet required after the City annexes new areas with Bluebonnet account customers;
- City's audit right limited to 3-years prior, set to coincide with Bluebonnet's records retention schedule;
- A right to purchase provision that is required by City Charter set at 1.5 times fair market value; and
Standard Terms including: Abide by City's current street-cut and other regulations; Indemnification for the City; Requirement to
relocate facilities at BEC's expense to accommodate City road construction or other improvements.
