- ChannelAustin continues as public access contractor
- Funding model changed by SB5
 - State franchise: capital funds only
 - TWC municipal franchise up August 2011
- New access contract begins October 1, 2011

Contract Differences: Funding

- New: \$450,000 annual budget from City
 - \$200,000 from current operating funds
 - \$250,000 from City General Fund
 - Beyond FY 12 \$450,000 annually from General Fund
- Old: \$617,500 from TW subscriber surcharge



Contract Differences: Term

- New: Four years
 - 2-year initial term
 - 2 one-year extensions
- Old: Six years
 - 2-year initial term
 - 2 two-year extensions



- Facilities open
 - New: 40 hrs/week, plus off-hours training services
 - Old: Unspecified actual 80-95 hrs/week
- Client service automation
 - New: 24/7 online client services automation
 - Old: No client services automation

Contract Differences: Reporting

- New: streamlined reporting (electronic)
 - semiannual activity reports
 - quarterly financial reports
 - monthly financials for Board; also to City
- Old: quarterly activity and financial reports prepared expressly for City (printed)

Contract Differences: Recap

- **\$450,000 vs. \$617,500**
- 4 years vs. 6 years
- 40 hrs/wk vs. 80 hrs/wk
- 24/7 online service vs. none
- Electronic reporting vs. special printed reports



- Contractor must generate additional operating funds: grants, rentals, training, advertising, sales, etc.
 - must offer "competitive market rates"
 - limited clientele: preserve non-profit status
- City conducts user satisfaction survey
- City effort to make building more energy efficient
- City may install separate meters for Master Control & TC room to pay for AC there by 11/01/11
- City provides capital funding from PEG fees and makes purchases (submit budget by April 1): equipment, software, maintenance contracts, improvement of facilities
