A History: Single-Member District Propositions

Since 1973, proposals on single-member districts have been presented to the Austin electorate six times. Each time the proposition failed, as follows:

April 17, 1973

- O Proposed 6 members from single-member districts and 5 (including the Mayor) elected at large.
- o The proposition failed 63% to 37%.

April 1, 1978

- O Proposed 8 members from single-member districts and the Mayor elected at large.
- o The proposition failed 71% to 28%.

■ January 19, 1985

- O Proposed 8 members from single-member districts and the Mayor elected at large.
- o The proposition failed 57% to 43%.

May 7, 1988

- o Proposed 8 members from single-member districts and the Mayor elected at large.
- o The proposition failed 57% to 43%.

May 7, 1994

- Proposed 8 members from single-member districts and the Mayor elected at large.
- o The proposition failed 52% to 48%.

May 4, 2002

- O Proposed 8 members from single-member districts and 3 (including the Mayor) elected at large.
- o The proposition failed 58% to 42%.
