Authorize award and execution of a 36-month supply agreement with INDUSTRIAL ASPHALT, Austin, TX, for hot mix-cold laid asphaltic concrete cold mix, Type D for the Public Works Department in an amount not to exceed \$111,750 with three 12-month extension options in an amount not to exceed \$37,250 for each option, for a total contract amount not to exceed \$223,500.
