Additional Backup Information				

The City of Austin is partnering with Travis County to develop and construct a section of Tuscany Way South from US Highway 290 to Springdale Road as a 4-lane divided major arterial. The project is located within the Full Purpose Annexation Area and 2 Mile Extraterritorial Jurisdiction of the City. The cost-share project with Travis County forms a connecting link in the future transportation infrastructure of the City and will provide for interconnectivity to State Highway 130 in the City's Desired Development Zone.

As set forth in the Interlocal Agreement, the County will provide the project management services for the development and construction of the project; the City will be responsible for review and approval of project specifics. The plans and specifications of the project shall be in accordance with the design and construction standards applicable under Title 30, Austin City Code (Austin/Travis County Subdivision Regulations) and all Texas Accessibility Standards. Within 30 days after the effective date of the signed Agreement, the City will pay the County \$1,500,000 as the City's financial contribution to the project. The County will pay for the remaining costs for development and construction of the project.
