The City of Austin has an existing \$35,000 contract with the Ending Community Homelessness Coalition (ECHO) for community coordination activities related to preventing and ending homelessness through March 31, 2012. This amendment will extend the contract term to September 2012 and add an additional \$17,500 for said extension. The amendment will also allow ECHO to hire an HMIS Program Manager as recommended in the July 2011 Austin's Homeless Management Information System (HMIS), Analysis and Recommendations Report. Funding for this position is in an amount not to exceed \$64,500.

In FY 2011, the City Manager charged City staff with analyzing the current Homeless Management Information System, review best practices in other Communities and make recommendations to enhance Austin's HMIS system to provide reliable data that enables the entire community to understand, prevent, and end homelessness. The key recommendation in the report is that ECHO should hire an HMIS Program Manager to promote ECHO's leadership role in operating and managing the HMIS program in this community. This will lead to the implementation of other recommendations in that report, improve overall HMIS data quality, and support the community's ability to address homelessness and draw down federal funding for homeless services. The HMIS program is administered centrally, but the value of the data depends on accurate, responsive commitment from multiple service providers in the community.

The HMIS Program Manager will: Lead, staff, and manage HMIS program and projects Improve HMIS data quality and reporting Improve HMIS program responsiveness to community needs Maximize the effectiveness of HMIS training Increase participation of agencies that do not receive federal homeless services funding Help ECHO improve community understanding of the value of accurate HMIS data Explore opportunities to partner with other database integration efforts to develop information that will benefit Homeless Services Providers
