A grant call for Texas Traffic Safety Funds was made by the Texas Department of Transportation on February 04, 2011. In May of 2011, the Austin Police Department and the Public Works Department's Bicycle Program partnered to distribute bicycle lights to the community with a focus on bicyclists riding without lights.

This Grant Agreement will allow the City to use Texas Traffic Safety Funds to purchase and distribute an additional \$10,200 worth of front and rear bicycle light sets, which will include an informational card about bicycle safety and the legal requirements for using lights when riding a bicycle at night. The proposed outcome of the grant is to increase public information and education efforts on bicycle safety, while also decreasing the number of motor vehicle-related bicycle fatalities. The City of Austin in-kind match of \$3,336 will be provided through volunteer hours (assembly and distribution).

All department grant application requests are reviewed by the Budget Office prior to submission to ensure that the grant minimizes the financial impact to the City.
