Approve ratification of a contract with FSTI, INC., Austin, TX for an emergency purchase of bulk liquid chlorine for the Austin Water Utility (AWU) for a total contract amount not to exceed \$162,000.

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Additional Backup Information

On August 23, 2011, the South Austin Regional Wastewater Treatment Plant (SAR) experienced a release of chlorine from a one-ton container. Austin Water Utility staff was able to restore operations for part of the plant and although the plant is not fully operational, it is expected to be able to meet the demands under normal conditions until the repairs are completed. Chlorine gas is extremely corrosive and the existing gas chlorine feed system has been damaged. A temporary sodium hypochlorite feed system has been set up in order to meet all federal and state permit requirements in order for the wastewater to be chlorinated to kill pathogens such as viruses and bacteria before the effluent enters into either the reclaimed system or is discharged back into the river.

This emergency purchase of sodium hypochlorite, a bleach type chlorine solution, will be used in the temporary system. The temporary system will remain operational until the extent of the damage caused by the leak has been evaluated and the permanent repairs have been completed.

In an effort to get competition, two vendors were called to submit a quote. Quotes were received from FSTI, Inc., Austin, TX for \$162,000 and Commercial Chemical, Houston, TX for \$189,600.
