PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1930 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story rectangular-plan front-gabled frame bungalow with a partial-width inset porch; single and paired 1:1 windows.

RESEARCH

The house appears to have been built around 1930 for Peter and Lydia Schneider, who lived here for the rest of their lives. Peter Schneider was a press feeder for the University of Texas Press from the time he moved into this house until his retirement. Lydia Schneider was a home-maker.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is not listed in any city survey.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Release the demolition permit upon completion of a City of Austin Documentation Package consisting of photographs of all four elevations, a dimensioned sketch plan, and a narrative history of the property. The house has neither the architectural nor the historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark, but staff would encourage the applicant to consider relocation and re-use of the house.
