My name is Ricardo Soliz, Division Manager for Planning & Design for the Parks & Recreation Department. Thank you for the opportunity to speak to this committee to report on what my department has been doing to implement the 2006 bonds.

First of all, let me introduce members of the staff that are here with me this morning, Tony Arnold, CIP Manager, and Butch Smith, Senior Planner involved with Trail planning and land acquisitions.

I would like to report that the our department is extremely busy working on projects throughout the city that are focused on facility renovations like Doris Miller Auditorium, NW Recreation Center, Susanna Dickinson House; New facilities like the Dittmar Recreation Center Gym, BMX & Skate Park at Austin Recreation Center; Pool renovations; and playscape replacements.

We are also working on acquisition and development of infill parks. Our gap analysis map indicates areas of the city that are deficient in neighborhood parkland. (Show the map)
