Additional Backup Information						
The Smoking in Public Places Ordinance was first enacted on January 1, 1986 and this restricted smoking in enclosed public places including places of employment. Since 1986, this ordinance has been amended and reorganized into the current ordinance which was approved by referendum election on May 7, 2005. The current version of the Smoking in Public Places ordinance includes an indoor smoking prohibition with limited exceptions. This amendment to Smoking in Public Places prohibits smoking in City parks. This includes city-owned athletic fields, nature preserves and swimming pools. Cigarettes and second hand smoke contain more than 7,000 chemicals including 69 known carcinogens presenting a serious health and environmental risk. Tobacco related litter is the most
