Call Priority Emergency Communications

Incident categories from incoming calls by order of priority:

HOT SHOT:

- o In progress
- o Immediate threat to life and/or public safety
- o Examples: shootings, stabbings, rapes, riots
- Dispatched immediately

• URGENT/PRIORITY 1:

- Against persons
- o Just occurred
- o Offender is still in the area
- Officers may be able to apprehend the subject and/or prevent further injury.
- Examples: Disturbances, Shots Fired/Heard, Burglaries
- o Dispatched within one minute

• PRIORITY 2:

- Against property
- o In progress or just occurred
- o Examples: auto thefts, car burglaries, suspicious persons
- Dispatch within 5 minutes

PRIORITY 3:

- Protection of life or property is not at risk
- Immediate police response will not likely prevent further injury, loss of property or adversely impact an investigation
- o Pay phone Hang Ups, Phone report refusal, Parking Violations, No Injury Collisions
- Dispatch these calls within 15 minutes.

• INFORMATION:

- Do not require police response
- o Require documentation and/or dissemination to law enforcement personnel.
- Examples: Reckless drivers where the caller no longer sees the vehicle, EMS or AFD calls that do not require police response
