On November 8, 2007, City Council approved a resolution requiring compliance with the standards and principles of the City's MBE/WBE Ordinance on eligible third party agreements, including addressing ethnic specific MBE/WBE utilization goals, good faith efforts, MBE/WBE participation reports, establishment of an outreach program to solicit participation, and training City staff negotiating third party agreements on MBE/WBE program requirements.

At the request of the MBE/WBE and Small Business Advisory Committee, City Staff and Committee Members reviewed the current Third Party Resolution and identified areas to expand the current resolution. The proposed amendments to the resolution include the following:

- Apply standards and principles to facilities constructed following a City endorsement pursuant to the Major Events Trust Fund statue;
- Encourage recruiting employees from Austin;
- Apply sanctions to violations of the standards and principles of the MBE/WBE Procurement Program;
- Failure to comply with contract terms results in forfeiture of funds received from the City; and,
- Also includes amendments that codify current SMBR practices.

The proposed amendments have been reviewed and approved by the MBE/WBE and Small Business Advisory Committee and MBE/WBE and Small Business Council Committee.
