Charter identified adoption process

1. **Planning Commission** forwards proposed plan to City Manager
2. **City Manager** submits plan to City Council with recommendations
3. After at least one public hearing, **City Council** may:
 - a. Adopt
 - b. Adopt with amendments
 - c. Return the plan to Planning Commission with “policy direction” within 60 days
4. If plan is returned to **Planning Commission**, the process restarts
