This action amends the Fiscal Year 2011-2012 Service Agreement with the City of Austin and Austin Housing Finance Corporation (AHFC) Grant Operating Budget to appropriate funds available through the Fiscal Year 2011 - 2012 Operating Budget Special Revenue Fund of the Neighborhood Housing and Community Development Office in the amount of \$2,315,481. If approved, this funding will be made available for the Colony Park Sustainable Community Pilot Project, and will be used to create a master plan for the 208-acre Colony Park tract, near the intersection of Loyola and Decker Lanes.

Purchased by the City in 2001 and transferred to the AHFC, the 208 acres have been reserved to create a mixed-use, mixed-income development which will include housing, retail and services. The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Community Challenge Grant offers the opportunity to begin the planning process for this master development. The AHFC will serve as the master developer for the Colony Park project.
