<u>SUMMARY STAFF RECOMMENDATION</u>: Staff **does not recommend** the proposed zoning change from single family residence, neighborhood plan (SF-3-NP) combining district to single family residence – Historic Landmark, neighborhood plan (SF-3-H-NP) combining district zoning.

QUALIFICATIONS FOR LANDMARK DESIGNATION:

Staff does not believe that the house meets the architectural nor the historical significance criteria for individual landmark designation.

<u>HISTORIC LANDMARK COMMISSION ACTION</u>: February 27, 2012: Postponed the case to March 26, 2012 to allow the property owner to meet with interested parties from the neighborhood. **March 26, 2012**: Initiated the historic zoning case to allow the property owner to meet with interested parties from the neighborhood.

STAFF UPDATE:

The property owner met with staff and representatives from the neighborhood to discuss preservation alternatives for this house. The owner cannot rehabilitate or preserve this house on site, but would like to sell it to a buyer who plans to move the house to a location on Tillery Street in East Austin. The house has been completely gutted on the inside.

BASIS FOR RECOMMENDATION:

Staff does not recommend this house for landmark designation because it is a very common architectural type in the city, and does not have the requisite historical significance in its history of occupancy.

Architecture:

One-story, rectangular-plan clipped-front-gabled frame bungalow with a partial-width clipped front-gabled partially-inset front porch; single and paired 1:1 fenestration.

Historical Associations:

City utility permits and city directories indicate that the house was built in 1930 by Henry Wendlandt, a local real estate developer. The first owners and occupants were C.H. and Genie Baker, who appear in the 1930-31 city directory as well as the 1930 U.S. Census report at this address, along with the indication that they were the owners of the property. The Bakers only lived here a short time, by 1932, the house was listed as vacant in the city directory. By 1935, Lloyd and Pauline Sibert were renting the house; he was a fireman. By 1937, the house was occupied by William O. and Pearl Caffey. William O. Caffey was originally from Bartlett, Texas, where he lived in 1930 and worked as a house painter. By the mid-1930s, Caffey had entered the oil business – listings in the city directories from 1935 through 1944-45 show him as a driller or oil operator. James E. and Bonnie Smith are shown as the owners and occupants of the house from 1947 to 1965. James E. Smith had several occupations while living here – an employee of the Austin Public School system, an attendant at Austin State Hospital, and a clerk at a liquor store. The house was vacant in 1966, and then became a rental unit, with Hispanic tenants through the present.



Plans for 2004 Holly

After meeting with City staff multiple times, receiving staff support for our plan, and meeting with concerned citizens April 3rd, 2012 as requested by the Historical Commission, here is a cooperative approach:

- Relocate existing house to 1006 Tillery in East Austin, 2 miles away, where it will be restored by local craftsman on site
- Construct new ENERGY STAR Certified single family home that fits style- and scale-wise into the Holly Neighborhood
- Work with the City and our arborist to save and improve as many trees as possible
- Home does not max out site, will be owner-occupied, does not include a secondary apartment, and no variances will be requested
- City staff Historical Preservation staff concludes structure is not historic—this
 approach was cooperatively developed with City and neighborhood input in the
 spirit of cooperation and preservation

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES:

C.H. and Genie Baker are listed in the 1930 U.S. Census report at this address. C.H. Baker was then 26, had been born in Texas, and was a laborer for the city street department. Genie Baker was then 23, and had been born in Texas. They owned this house, and had a young son, Bobbie.

William O. and Pearl Caffey appear in the 1930 U.S. Census report for Bartlett, Texas, where they lived in a rented house with daughter Frances, 8, and son W.O., Jr., 6. William O. Caffey was then 38 years old; Pearl Caffey was then 34. Both had been born in Texas. William O. Caffey is listed as a house painter. William O. Caffey died in Harris County, Texas in April, 1959; Pearl Caffey was living in Houston, but died in an Austin hospital in May, 1959..
