**ANALYSIS / ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:** The additional funding of \$163,704 includes \$89,500 for the partnership program, and \$74,204 for COA-EE/FHO to hire temporary employees who will process complaints generated by ATC's paired testing and file them with HUD. The COA-EE/FHO will be the sole recipient of HUD funding, and will pay ATC's partnership portion (\$45,000) based on performance of agreed upon roles and responsibilities over time. Acceptance of these additional grant funds will have no impact to the General Fund this fiscal year or in future years. This is a special initiative and one-time grant amendment for a partnership program which will not receive continued funding when the project is completed. Depending on the success or need identified in this initiative, COA-EE/FHO may seek future grant funding to conduct other similar initiatives.
