
Oakwood Cemetery Chapel Restoration Project

Oakwood Chapel History

- Built in 1914
- Designed by Architect Charles H. Page as a place to hold nondenominational memorial services and temporary interments
- The chapel was used for about 10-15 years before it fell out of fashion due to the rise in popularity of funeral homes
- It is currently used as office/storage space
- The condition of the chapel has deteriorated
- In order to return the chapel to a stable and standard condition, the building needs extensive, historically appropriate, repair/replacement work to the foundation, walls, roof, and windows









Project Partner and Proposal

- Founded in 2004, Save Austin's Cemeteries (SAC) is a non-profit organization dedicated to preserving historic cemeteries in Austin
- Long-standing partner with PARD
- PARD does not have funding to restore the chapel
- SAC Proposal: Fund & Implement Oakwood Cemetery Chapel Restoration

Project Proposal

- Project Cost Estimate: \$600,000
- Stakeholder meeting held in 2011 and there is community support to restore the chapel
- The project to be completed with private funding

Next Steps

Negotiate and execute an agreement with SAC for the restoration project

2. SAC will:

- Initiate a fundraising campaign to raise funds needed for project (approx. \$600k)
- Pay for and complete the project under PARD oversite

3. PARD will:

- Provide oversight of the project
- Review and approve the project at each step including:
 - Concept plan
 - Final design plan
 - Historic Landmark Commission approval
 - Construction documents
