## Additional Backup Information

For visitors or Austin residents seeking a place to stay for a short period of time, the short tem rental of a house of other residential structure has become an increasingly popular option. These short term rentals can offer great flexibility and a unique experience for visitors, and can provide an important source of income for the property owner.

As these short term rentals become more popular, homeowners that reside near them have questioned whether the rental of residential structures for short durations should be more appropriately considered a commercial rather than residential activity, and regulated accordingly.

The Planning Commission has worked extensively with stakeholders and has drafted a proposal to regulate the short term rental of residential structures through amendments to the land development code.
