5. NEW BUSINESS

- a) CONRAC Project Update. A meeting was held last week with the design build team and our consultant to go over the design. Hope to move into construction sets by the end of August. Secretary D'Ann Johnson and Commission Member Rose Marie Klee reported on the artist interviews.
- b) Open Discussion on Taxi operations at the airport. Outreach has been done to the health department for a mobile health unit to come and do checkups for the taxi drivers. The bathrooms are being locked at midnight due to vandalism.
- c) Status update on VOR checkpoint. There seems to be too weak of a signal to make it effective so there are talks that Austin Executive might have a stronger signal.

- d) Part 139 Inspection results. Part 139 is the airport operating certificate. The FAA was here for one week testing the competency of operation, maintenance and firefighting staff. The comments from the FAA have not been officially submitted to us but they did say there is an excess of paint buildup on the taxi way center lines so staff is removing the paint as we speak.
- e) FAA Title 6 Audit. There is nothing to report other than they are here and reviewing our documentation. This is the first time we have gone through it so we are not sure what the process is. This is a new program for the FAA so there is no schedule on how often they will do this.
- f) Operating Budget Update. Yolanda Tovar, Financial Manager, Aviation Department presented the 2013 Operating Budget Update. A concern was brought up about the increase in cab fees and long term parking and how it compares to other airports.

6. OLD BUSINESS (updates)

Authorize award and execution of a 6-month service agreement with FORTBRAND SERVICES, INC., for portable preconditioned aircraft air conditioning and heating unit rental services for the Aviation Department in an amount not to exceed \$65,000. [Item went before City Council on May 24, 2012 and passed.]

Authorize award and execution of a 36-month requirements supply contract with WENZEL, WENZEL, & ASSOCIATES, for the purchase of rollup traffic signs in an estimated amount not to exceed \$420,000, with three 12-month extension options in an estimated amount not to exceed \$140,000 per extension option, for a total estimated contract amount not to exceed \$840,000. Authorize negotiation and execution of revenue producing agreements with rental car companies to operate rental car concessions at a consolidated rental car facility at Austin-Bergstrom International Airport. [Item went before City Council on May 24, 2012 and passed.]

Authorize negotiation and execution of a master lease with Austin CONRAC, LLC to construct, maintain, and operate the CONRAC facility for the operation of rental car concessions at Austin-Bergstrom International Airport. [Item went before City Council on May 24, 2012 and passed.]

b) Approve an ordinance authorizing the defeasance and redemption of all outstanding Airport System Variable Rate Revenue Notes, Series A; amending the Fiscal Year 2011-2012 Airport Capital Fund Operating Budget of the Aviation Department (Ordinance No. 20110912-005) by increasing transfers out by \$28,000,000 to the Airport Variable Rate Bond Debt Service Fund, amending the Airport Variable Rate Bond Debt Service Fund (Ordinance No. 20110912-005) increasing transfers in by \$28,000,000, and appropriating these funds and authorizing all other actions to be taken for the defeasance and redemption of all outstanding Airport System Variable Rate Revenue Notes, Series A.

Grants will be made available to 4 public-use airports. The purpose of the grant is to support joint planning, engineering, design, and environmental permitting of projects, including the assembly and redevelopment of property purchased with noise mitigation funds. Questions have been submitted to the FAA s Airports Acquisition Specialist in Washington D.C. in order to understand the provisions in the enactment. 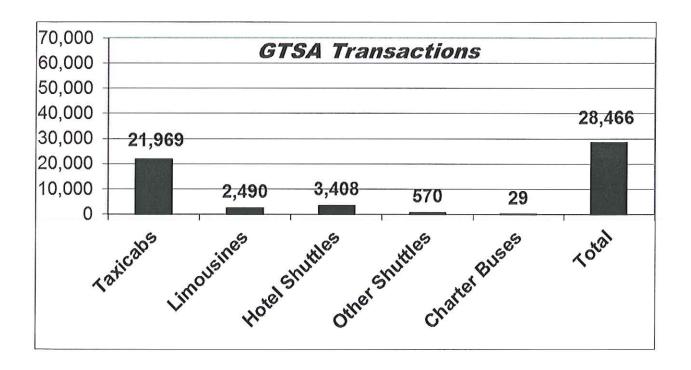

	Additional Backup Information

This project addresses two critical operational needs: increased security at the Terminal and improved traffic flow within the Airport. Currently large planters are arranged in front of the Terminal on the upper and lower levels. These were intended to provide hazardous vehicle mitigation, but were not optimally located to prevent hostile vehicles and are unsightly due to poor conditions for sustaining vegetation. Therefore, the planters are being replaced with strategically located, structurally designed barriers that will enhance security and be more aesthetically consistent with the Terminal design.

Access from Presidential Boulevard to the Airport service roads was purposefully limited in the original design. However, operationally this limitation has led to inefficiencies of traffic flow, especially with the addition of a cell phone lot and the impending development south of the Hilton hotel and west of Presidential Boulevard. A new road from Presidential Boulevard to Spirit of Texas Drive will greatly enhance public convenience by providing better access to the cell phone lot and the site of future public amenities which are currently accessed via service roads.

This project will construct a new road from Presidential Boulevard to Spirit of Texas Drive, provide a temporary cell phone lot and add security barriers to the upper and lower level curbsides at the Terminal building for additional security. The proposed roadway consists of two 11-feet wide travel lanes, 11-feet wide medians containing rain gardens, and 7-feet wide meandering sidewalks on both sides of the roadway, bordered by 6-feet wide, tree-lined landscaped areas. The cell phone lot is landscaped with curbside trees. The proposed connection between the cell phone lot and the roadway is a meandering, tree-lined sidewalk. Airport land in the vicinity of the proposed road is planned to include new retail and commercial amenities, such as a gas station and convenience store.

This project is designed to be in accordance with the Department of Aviation's mission to be as sustainable as possible. Key sustainability features include:

- Rain gardens to capture and allow rainfall to percolate slowly
- Drought-tolerant plants
- · Pervious sidewalk
- Natural stone as a landscape feature
- · Drip irrigation using reclaimed water
- Solar-powered irrigation controller
- LED lighting

Due to the potential for unknown features and/or conflicts when working with existing conditions and the need to avoid delay in working at the Airport, a 10% contingency has been included to allow for the expeditious processing of any change orders.

The contract allows 270 calendar days for completion of this project, located within zip code 78719. This project is managed by the Public Works Department.

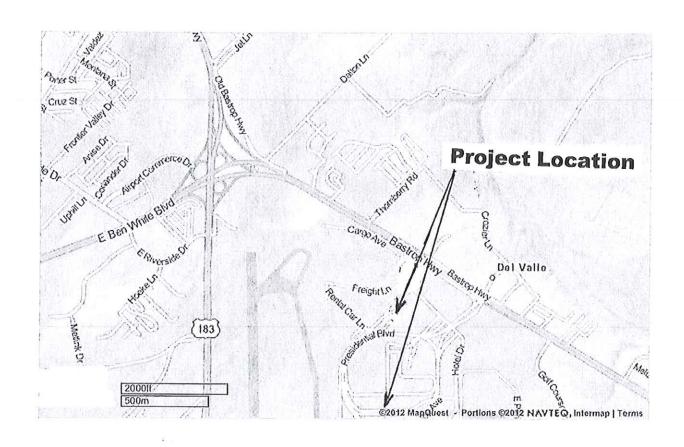

This contract will provide tree-trimming and removal services for the City's forest, medians, roads, right-of-ways, line-of-sight maintenance and clearance, stormwater facilities and associated structures, drainage utility easement, and other City properties. The main objectives of this contract are to provide for the safety of people and property; to preserve trees and to maintain them in a healthy and vigorous condition; to maintain the efficient operation of stormwater facilities; and to maintain the aesthesics of both the trees and the environment.

Trees located on street right-of-ways and medians will be managed by the Street & Bridge Division of the Public Works Department operating under the authority of the City's Urban Forester. Trees located in or adjacent to stormwater facilities and drainage utility easements will be managed by the Watershed Protection Department and under the authority of the City's Urban Forester. The City's Urban Forester shall administer and enforce all management of work on all other trees located within the City's urban forest.
