This contract is for the purchase of maintenance and support for existing software and for the purchase of additional software modules and services to support and expand the City's geographic information systems (GIS). Software provided by Esri was adopted as the City's enterprise standard GIS software by the Corporate GIS Operating Board in the City's strategic priorities. The City has maintained an Esri Enterprise License Agreement since 2004.

Spatial data is a basic component of the majority of new applications and for services such as 3-1-1, 9-1-1, and planning. Most City departments create GIS data using Esri products, and many other departments and the general public make use of these GIS data products through data sharing within the City and through the Austin GO web site. As the City further develops its enterprise wide GIS system, Communications and Technology Management (CTM) must ensure all departments are using the same software release and are provided the same level of service for their Esri software. An Esri enterprise license agreement assures that all departments are able to follow the Esri standard that Corporate GIS Operating Board has adopted.

To fully realize the capability and benefits of geographic information and GIS technology, spatial data must be shared and systems need to be interoperable. GIS technology provides the framework for shared spatial data infrastructure and distributed architecture. Esri has developed its products based on open standards to ensure a high level of interoperability across platforms, databases, development languages, and applications.
