Additional Backup Information

On June 12, 2003, Council approved Resolution No. 030612-76 allocating 30% of the parking meter revenue gathered within a certain area of downtown to the Downtown Great Streets Parking Meter Revenue Fund and 70% remaining in the General Fund.

On August 18, 2011, Council approved Ordinance 20110818-074 authorizing extended hours of parking meter collection.

The Austin Transportation Department seeks a resolution to clarify Council's intent that only 30% of that portion of the revenue collected Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. be dedicated to the Great Streets Development Fund, and 70% allocated to the Parking Meter Fund.

For revenue collected during extended hours in the downtown area, and in lieu of the Great Streets Parking Meter Fund, 40% allocated to downtown transportation improvements dedicated annually to projects and or services in the downtown area, and the remaining 60% of the revenue to be allocated to the Parking Meter Fund.

There is no impact to the General Fund caused by this clarification and action.
