## 3. Introduction of Twin Oaks Branch Manager Anita Fudell

The new Twin Oaks opened in August 2010. Circulation and the number of customers visiting have increased three-fold since the opening at the new location.

# **4.** Discussion: Capital Funding Campaign and Naming Opportunities for the New Central Library

Tim Staley, Executive Director, Austin Public Library Friends Foundation presented information on how capital campaigns work. The campaign for the New Central Library will be announced two years before the grand opening, but the leadership gifts will have already been secured. The smaller scale giving will be opened to the general public and all levels of giving will be acknowledged.

## 5. Presentation: Youth Services Programming

David Spradling, Youth Services Manager, spoke about the Summer Reading Program and Storytime. Children earn a free book for every Summer Reading log they complete and turn in. Storytimes are offered year round. Over 50,000 youths and families attend youth programs every year.

Heath Rezabek, Teen Services Coordinator spoke about programs for tweens and teens. The Dell Connected Youth project, formerly Dell Wired for Youth, was launched in 2009. The

fourth annual YomiCon had over 1,000 attendees. The Dell Discovery Lab, which officially opened in May 2012, has been funded for another year.

Kathleen Houlihan, Youth Program Librarian, spoke about Literature Live performances that use puppets to bring stories to life. The Second Chance Books Program at the Gardner Betts Juvenile Center is a library program run by Youth Services that works with incarcerated youth.
