PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1940 house moved to this site in 1956 from 1311 East Live Oak Street.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story rectangular-plan side-gabled frame house with asbestos siding above a brick veneer wainscot; central, partial-width, front-gabled over-door hood; paired 1:1 fenestration.

RESEARCH


Research indicates that this house was built around 1940 by dairy owner David M. Bryant and his wife, Ollie, as a rental unit for workers on their dairy farm. David Bryant first owned a dairy on what is now South Congress Avenue (then listed as Post Road), and moved to 1401 East Live Oak Street around 1930. The 1930 U.S. Census report shows the Bryants on Post Road; the 1940 U.S. Census shows them on Burleson Road, the early name for the eastern stretch of what is East Live Oak Street now. The 1940 U.S. Census also shows a rental house on the Bryants' property, rented by a milker at their dairy (although the 1941 city directory does not list the address). The Bryants stopped renting to their employees in the mid-1940s – the 1944-45 city directory shows that the house was rented by a switchman for the telephone company. By 1947, the Bryants' son, David M. Bryant, Jr., and his wife were renting the house while he worked on the dairy farm. The house was rented out again by a non-family member and non-employee of the Bryants in the mid-1950s, and then moved to its current location by Arthur Schriber in 1956. Arthur Schriber, a District Chief for the Austin Fire Department, lived at 1207 East Live Oak Street, in a house that has now been moved by his family to their property west of the city.

STAFF COMMENTS

The house is beyond the bounds of the Comprehensive Cultural Resources Survey (1984).

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Encourage relocation over demolition if the house is structurally sound and able to be moved. The house was moved to the site in 1956, and was a rental house built by a dairy owner for his employees, and then his son, so it lacks the requisite architectural and historical significance to warrant individual designation as a historic landmark.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

DAVID M. and OLLIE BRYANT and FAMILY

David M. and Ollie Bryant appear in the 1940 U.S. Census report at an un-numbered house on Burleson Road. David M. Bryant was then 60, had been born in Tennessee, and was the owner of a retail dairy. Ollie Bryant was then 55, and had been born in Texas. She had no occupation listed. With them lived their children: David M., Jr., 14, Doris, 11, and Dudley, 6. The census report indicates that there was a rental unit on the property as well, occupied by Charlie and Velma Adkins, both in their 20s. Charlie Adkins was a milker on a dairy, most likely the one owned by David Bryant. The Bryant's house was worth \$5,000 (compared to the more commodious bungalow owned by neighbor Ralph Klunkert, now located at 2208 Schriber Street), which leads to the conclusion that the Bryants' house was a much larger house than this.

The 1930 U.S. Census shows David and Mary O. Bryant living on a dairy on the Post Road, which was the far southern reaches of what is South Congress Avenue today. David Bryant is listed as the owner of a dairy. Their three children are listed with them, as is a step-daughter, Estelle Sullivan, who was then 20 and was a credit clerk in a hardware store.
