This contract is for thermoplastic pavement marking materials for the Transportation Department. The preformed thermoplastic material will be utilized in the Roadway Markings Program. Roadway markings are used to convey messages to roadway users such as which part of the road to use, information about conditions ahead, and indicate where passing is allowed. Using durable preformed thermoplastic material instead of paint has greatly increased the life of the pavement marking program. Thermoplastic markings have a service life that outlasts paint by two to three years depending on traffic volumes. The durability and good retroreflectivity of thermoplastic makes it the ideal method for striping high-traffic-volume roadways.

This material will be used in the roadway installation of words such as ONLY and SCHOOL, as well as arrows, bike symbols, crosswalk lines, and identifying speed humps. Preformed thermoplastic is also used to improve visibility of pavement markings during the day on light-colored asphalt and concrete roads.
