Subject

Approve an increase to the franchise fee charged to Pedernales Electric Cooperative for the use of the City's rights-of-way in accordance with section 10.2 of the franchise adopted by City Ordinance No. 20081016-031, increasing the franchise fee to 6½ percent of gross receipts for the 12-month period beginning December 1, 2012 and 4½ percent of gross receipts for the following four-year period.

Amount and Source of Funding

Additional \$2.0 million in franchise fee revenue for FY13 General Fund.

Additional Backup Information

Pedernales Electric Cooperative (PEC) holds a franchise from the City of Austin for the maintenance of an electric power utility system within the City by Ordinance No. 20081016-031. Section 10.2 of the franchise ordinance requires PEC to pay the City two percent (2%) of its gross receipts received from retail services provided within the City, provided that the fee will increase to match any higher percentage paid by PEC under a franchise with any other Texas municipality.

Due to a renegotiated franchise, PEC's franchise fee to the City of San Marcos for a 12-month period is six and one-half percent ($6\frac{1}{2}$ %) of its gross receipts after which time it will pay four and one-half percent ($4\frac{1}{2}$ %).

In accordance with Section 10.2 of PEC's Austin franchise ordinance, by this approval PEC's franchise fee will increase to $6\frac{1}{2}$ % for a 12-month period beginning on December 1, 2012 and a $4\frac{1}{2}$ % of gross receipts for the following 4-year period.

The franchise fee increase to 6 ½ % is estimated to generate an additional \$2.0 million in revenue for the City in FY

13. Thereafter, the $4\frac{1}{2}$ % fees are estimated to generate approximately \$1.5 million in additional annual revenue for FY 14, \$1.3 million for FY 15, and \$1.4 million annually in FY 16 & FY 17.	
PEC noted that the amount of the fee increased over the current two percent (2%) will be stated as a separate line item on the customer bills. PEC serves approximately 20, 000 customers in the city limits.
