

**SUMMARY OF APPROVAL PROCESS
FOR REVISIONS TO CITY CODE SECTION 25-2-739**

Proposed changes to Section 25-2-739 Rainey Street Subdistrict Regulations:

(j) The development qualifies for five points for each historically significant building structure that is preserved on-site or relocated to a site within the Rainey Street subdistrict or that is relocated to a location within City Limits determined appropriate by the Historic Landmark Commission, up to a maximum of 25 points. A building structure is historically significant if the City's historic preservation officer determines that the building structure contributed to the historic character of the Rainey Street National Historic Register District as of May 1, 2012.
