PROPOSAL

Demolish a ca. 1939 house.

ARCHITECTURE

One-story, rectangular-plan hipped-roof frame house with a partial-width flat-roofed independent porch on plain, square wood posts. Modern replacement fenestration.

RESEARCH

The house was built in 1939 by Thomas and Rebecca Hopper, who had been living next door at 712 West Johanna Street. Thomas Hopper was a cattle buyer, who had previously worked for the city utility department. Rebecca Hopper is listed as the owner of the house in the 1944-45 city directory, and was a chauffeur; Thomas Hopper is listed in the directory, but without an occupation, and living at 203 Red River Street. Neither Thomas nor Rebecca Hopper are listed in the 1947 city directory, so it may be inferred that Thomas and Rebecca Hopper divorced in the mid-1940s, and Rebecca Hopper married John O. Monaghan, with whom she is listed in the 1947 directory. However, Thomas Hopper died in 1949, and was survived by his widow, Reba, but this may not be Rebecca Hopper.


Rebecca Hopper is listed in the 1947 city directory as the wife of John Monaghan; he and Rebecca owned and occupied the house until the early 1950s. According to the obituaries of Thomas Hopper and Rebecca Monaghan, it is clear that Rebecca Hopper later became Rebecca Monaghan, based upon the names of their children, which appear in both obituaries. Following the occupancy of the Monaghans, the house was then a rental unit until the early 1960s, when it was purchased by Tomás and Mary Longoria, who lived here through the 1990s. Tomás Longoria was a carpet layer.

STAFF COMMENTS


The house does not appear in any City survey.

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

THOMAS and REBECCA HOPPER (ca. 1939 – ca. 1946)

Thomas and Rebecca Hopper appear in the 1940 U.S. Census report at this address, a house they owned, and which was worth \$1,000. Thomas A. Hopper was then 48, had been born in Texas, and was a cattle buyer. Rebecca Hopper was then 31 and had been born in Texas. They had two young daughters. The 1930 U.S. Census shows Thomas and Rebecca Hopper living at 1903 Holly Street in Austin, a house they owned. Thomas Hopper was a laborer for the city water department.
