

Allocation of Public Computers

There is no exact formula, but many variables are considered:

- Physical space & furniture
- Circulation
- Door count (number of customers using the library)
- Electrical capacity of the building
- ADA considerations
- Data cabling
- Funds available for purchase of equipment
- Input from branch/Central library staff

WIFI is available at all locations, enabling customers who have their own equipment (laptops, tablets, smart phones) to connect to the Internet rather than using public computers.

A successful pilot project at the Ruiz Branch Library confirmed that circulating laptop computers for in-house use is a viable alternative to desktop public computers, although it does present some challenges:

- Secure storage for the laptops
- Cannot currently offer wireless printing (This is also a challenge when customers have their own devices)
- Space for recharging as well as storing the equipment
